Objectives	Students will review how to search the School Library System provided eBooks and find articles that pertain to their topics.	<p>Materials Needed</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Computer with internet access and display capability • Computers for class use with Internet and printer access
Information	<p>Using the school or SLS provided eBooks, the librarian will review with students the means to locate information. Topics should include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ Finding eBooks on the SLS or library web page ❖ Key word search ❖ Subject Guide Search ❖ Advanced Search ❖ Related searches ❖ Using the <i>Sources</i> division for further information <p>Librarian will model a search using the above topics and compare results from each type of search</p>	
Verification	Students will be divided into groups and perform a search on the Bakke case. Each group should be assigned a different strategy – Basic, advanced, subject, keyword, and related search. Students will report back to the group on the positive and negative aspects of the search.	<p>Other Resources Gale eBooks purchased and provided by the Jefferson-Lewis School Library System (http://tinyurl.com/yIm4g6v)</p>
Activity	Students will conduct an eBook search for information pertaining to their court case. Search results should include a variety of sources. Students should list one additional source for their case referenced from the <i>Sources</i> section of an article. Citations should be saved and printed so that they may be checked.	
Assessment	Students should have a minimum of 2 sources from the eBook collection that are relevant to their topic.	Additional Notes
